

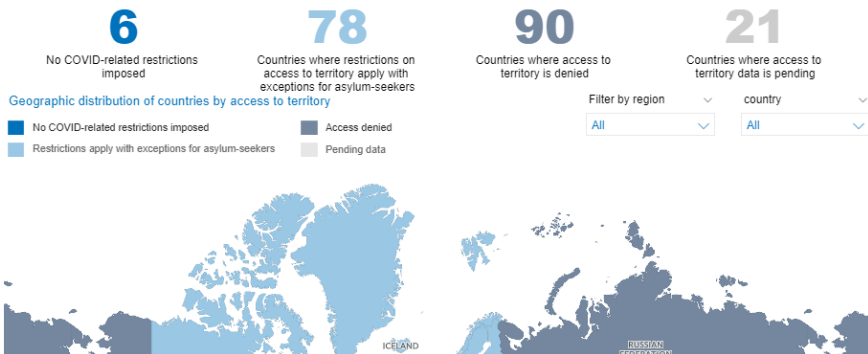


- Use the filters available on each page to select a specific region or country you want to view
- Use the navigation buttons to move through different pages and reset filters:
 - The “Next” and “Prev.” buttons can be used to navigate between the different pages of the dashboard
 - The “Reset” button removes all filters and returns the page to the default state
- You can also use the menu at the bottom to select the page (theme) you want to view

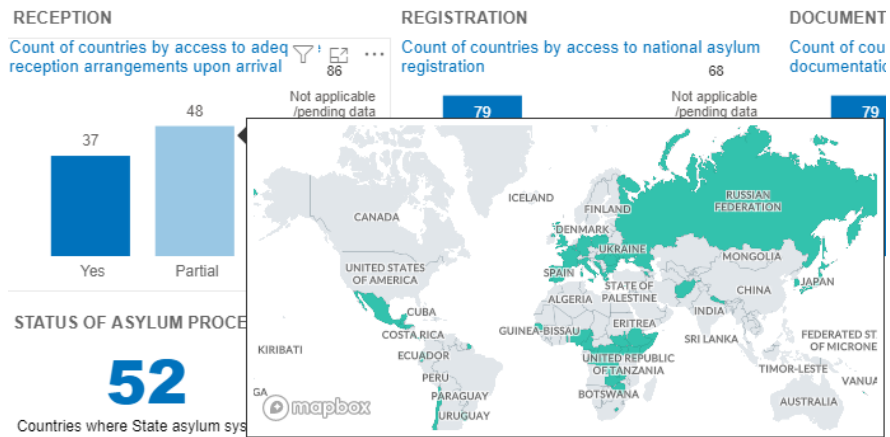
Borders and admission of asylum-seekers

States have a responsibility to protect public health and may temporarily close their borders to limit COVID19 transmission. At the same time, asylum-seekers also have a right to seek international protection at those borders, and may not be returned – either directly or indirectly – to a country of persecution or danger. The principle of non-refoulement is one of the most widely recognized norms of customary international law, thus requiring exceptions to any closed borders. As such, while borders may be “partially” closed, with restrictions on access to territory in place, “exceptions” are needed to enable access to territory by persons seeking international protection. Many states have both secured public health and the rights of asylum seekers to seek access to protection, including through screening and quarantine measures, for which international support could be extended as needed.



- Each page contains introductory text explaining the data provided.
- The large numbers (placed above the maps) show the number of countries per category as highlighted on the map.

Interaction - visuals



- If you hover over specific data-points (i.e. bars and columns in the charts), a map will pop up highlighting the countries that correspond to this category.
- Clicking on a data-point in a chart will filter the entire page to show only countries that correspond to that category. You can always click on the “reset” button to clear all filters.
